During the festive season our staff and volunteers worked many unsocial hours, to make sure those who are less fortunate were not missing out on the Christmas celebrations. There were four Christmas parties organised at the locations where usual meals are served i.e. One from the trailer in Blandford Square at Newcastle, one in St Andrew's Church in Newcastle, from the Bus in the grounds of St. Bede's Church at Middlesbrough and the other from the Bus in Kwik-Fit car park at Stockton. A four course meal was prepared and given to all who came to each of the venues, Christmas Carols were sung to the accompaniment of a CD player and Santa arrived at each party. There were approximately 40 quests at each venue who received useful presents, with a special present for those who sleep in the open air. This was a sleeping bag for each person which was donated by the Rotary Club of Middlesbrough. Grateful thanks was shown by each who received to those who provided for showing God's Love in Action.

The number of people who are in need of our support is sadly on the increase, and around 250 meals each week are now being served along with moral support and friendship by our staff and volunteers.
