In his present employment he was asked to make a delivery of goods to a playgroup at Gosforth in Newcastle. When he had completed his delivery the lady in charge told Alan that there was someone outside who would like to have a word with him. Alan went outside but didn't recognise the man, who went on to tell Alan that he was one of the last residents of Holly House and was evicted for using drugs. He went on to say that he was now clean from drugs, was married and at the playgroup to collect his child. He also mentioned that his wife was expecting another child and they all attend a church in Newcastle. Fundraising in the last three months has been quite hectic. At Ryhope Church there have been three coffee mornings and sale of goods, two entertainment evenings from ladies choirs, a Pie and Peas Supper and Quiz Night and a Carol Service given by Ryhope Churches Choir, where every denomination in Ryhope took part. There have also been three praise nights, the first at Murton Church, then Bankhead and the last at Boldon Church. These nights are always lively events where everyone enjoys the fellowship, with the next one

arranged for February 1st at Hebburn Church. The last fundraising event which I'm delighted to report was a bag at Sainsburvs of pack Washington, which took place in the last week before Christmas. In the past few months the support from the staff and management at this store has been tremendous.





There were six of our trustees among the volunteer bag packers, and the customers responded by donating over £700.00. This store continues to donate food on a regular basis which is greatly appreciated by all at NEHL and those who need it.
