A producer from Radio Tees contacted us after conducting an internet search for soup kitchens active in the North East. She requested interviews with workers, volunteers and a Trustee as a feature for the Lisa McCormick Show. The interviews were conducted at the Stockton kitchen whilst the trailer was still being used, two weeks before the new vehicle went into service. Lisa

McCormick conducted very sensitive fact finding interviews, showing a lot of understanding and feeling for the work being done. The broadcast show gave a very positive picture of the work of the Trust in Middlesbrough, Stockton and Newcastle.

St Andrew's Church in Newcastle, which has hosted our Thursday afternoon free of charge for many years, for which we are very grateful, will be undergoing refurbishment shortly. The work could last until Christmas. Though the notice was short, Brian managed to secure a suitable venue at a nearby church at a cost of £22 per week. Donations towards this expense would be gratefully received.

The Sunday evening kitchen in Blandford Square car park is continuing in rather difficult circumstances, since we do not have a vehicle for towing the catering trailer from Birtley. Numbers at this kitchen continue to grow and the food and hot drinks are served from car boots, in the way in which Walter and Anne began the work all those years ago. We would appreciate your prayers for the resolution of this problem.
