- Dean visited the kitchen in a red Porsche convertible. He has been alcohol free for a year and is back to work. Last week he ran the Sunderland Marathon for charity. A very happy outcome.

- A young girl came late to the kitchen. Her boyfriend had tried to hang her during the week and she had just been discharged from hospital. She is staying at her mams and sisters when they will put her up.

- Daniel was no better than last week. He is self harming and had a meeting during the week with his health worker. They are having a follow up meeting with him on Monday.
