The heavy snow and severe weather conditions caused havoc among motorists and commuters, with many seeking overnight refuge in cars, lorries, railway stations, airports etc. This has highlighted the problems which the homeless face every day on our streets.

The Christmas meals/parties were held in the week beginning 19th December 2010. A great deal of preparation went into meals of turkey, vegetables and Yorkshire puddings which was followed by Christmas Pudding and custard. During the preceding months, donations of hats, gloves, scarves, socks, toiletries,



books and sweets were collected on a regular basis. These were centrally stored and then groups of willing workers, at two venues, left their own Christmas shopping to wrap a total of 180 individual gifts which,
