They were provided with sleeping bags as well as hot meals and drinks.

We continue to be blessed with generous donations from our regular supporters. Birtley Bakery donates food every weekend, Bank Head IM Church supplied mince pies for the Christmas meal and Middlesbrough Rotary Club gave a generous donation towards the cost of the Christmas meals on Teesside.
